- Portfolio or briefcase



Men Business Casual Attire

- Khaki, gabardine or cotton pants, neatly pressed
- Long-sleeved button-down shirts, polo shirts, or knit shirts with a collar (tucked in)
- Sweaters
- Dark socks, leather shoes, and belt
- Tie optional



What Not to Wear on a Job Interview

- Flip-flops or sneakers
- Any underwear that shows
- Shorts
- Jeans
- Thick beards
- Low-riding pants



What Not to Bring to a Job Interview

- Gum
- Cell phone
- I-Pod
- Coffee or soda
- If you have piercings, leave them at home
- Cover tattoos



<u>Tips and Warnings</u>: Perfect grooming is your first assignment when you interview for a job. According to image consultants, 55% of another person's perception of you is based on how you look. You have one chance to make a first impression; it is better to dress too formally than to dress too casually; make sure you have appropriate interview attire and that everything fits correctly.
