Working in partnership with <u>Driscoll Children's Hospital</u>, <u>Texas Parent to Parent (TxP2P)</u>, and <u>Del Mar College-Emergency Medical Services</u>, EMSC presented Assessment and Management of Children with Special Health Care Needs. This course is a one-of-a-kind interactive educational program designed to provide EMS professionals with cognitive knowledge and practical, hands-on training to prepare them to handle a wide variety of emergency situations involving children with special needs.

While the course offers an opportunity to develop the technical knowledge and skills necessary for confident and competent care of children with special health care needs in the out-of-hospital emergency setting, its most

important and unique feature is the focus on patient- and family-centered care facilitated by the integration of special needs families into every aspect of the course....

Bringing together healthcare professionals from EMS and emergency/critical care nursing disciplines with special needs parents and their children provides a unique perspective on the challenges and common misperceptions of emergency assessment and management of children with special health care needs. The EMSC State Partnership is excited about this course and we are making plans now to offer the class in a different area of the state about once every quarter...
